Hafiz Abu Musa al-Madini 🙈

There are a number of great figures and luminaries from Islamic history who are seldom remembered for their innumerable contributions and efforts in keeping the spirit of Islam alive. Among them is the great Hadith master, Shaikh al-Islam, Hafiz Abu Musa al-Madini &

Full Name: Muhammad ibn Abu Bakr 'Umar ibn Abu 'Isa Ahmad ibn 'Umar al-Asbahani.

Birth Date: Dhul Qa'dah, 500 AH.

Passing Date: Jumada al-Ula 9th, 581 AH.

Some of his teachers: Abu Mansur Muhammad ibn 'Abdullah Mandawayh, Ghanim al-Burji, Abu 'Ali al-Haddad, Muhammad ibn 'Abdullah al-Sharrabi Ballizah, Hafiz Muhammad ibn Tahir al-Maqdisi¹, Abu Zakariyya ibn Mandah, Hibatullah ibn al-Hasan al-Abraquhi, Hibatullah ibn al-Husain al-Baghdadi and those of their caliber. He particularly studied under Abu al-Qasim al-Taymi and others.

Some of his students: Abu Sa'd al-Sam'ani², Abu Bakr Muhammad ibn Musa al-Hazimi³, Hafiz Abdul Ghani al-Maqdisi⁴, 'Abdul Qadir al-Ruhawi, Muhammad ibn Makki al-Asbahani, al-Nasih 'Abdur Rahman ibn al-Hanbali, and others.

Hafiz ibn 'Abdul Hadi 🙈 says,

"He was vast in knowledge, expansive in narration. He was the foremost in this field (of Hadith) along with having very short chains of narration."⁵

Some of his works:

- *Ma'rifah al-Sahabah*, wherein he provides corrections to Hafiz Abu Nu'aym's work on the same subject (on the lives of the Sahabah).

- Hafiz ibn Hajar al-'Asqalani as says that Hafiz Abu Musa al-Madini wrote a booklet on the subject of *Salat al-Tasbih*, supporting its authenticity.⁶

He once narrated the entirety of Imam al-Hakim's *A Mari'fah 'Uloom al-Hadith* to Hafiz Isma'eel *from memory*.

Al-Dubaythi as says, "Abu Musa lived until he became unmatched in his time, and the shaykh of his era with respect to both his chains of narration and in memory."

Al-Sam'ani as says, "I have heard from him, and he even wrote from me. He was reliable *(thiqah)*, truthful *(saduq)*."

'Abdul Qadir al-Ruhawi 🙈 says,

"He would not accept anything (i.e. renumeration for teaching) from anyone. Many people would (attempt to) give him wealth, and he would reject it, saying, 'distribute it among those whom you see fit,' and would refuse to accept it. He had such a level of humility that he would teach both children and adults, and he would guide beginners. I have seen him teaching children the memorization of the Qur'an using tablets. He would forbid people from walking with him (i.e. similar to an entourage). I (al-Ruhawi) once did this, for which he rebuked me. I studied under him for approximately a year and a half, and I never saw in him nor heard from him any such error for which he was criticized."

Abu Mas'ud 🙈 says, "Abu Musa is a hidden treasure."

Hafiz ibn 'Imad al-Hanbali 🙈 writes,

"Abu Musa al-Madini Muhammad ibn Abu Bakr 'Umar ibn Ahmad al-Hafiz passed away [in the year 581]. He authored numerous works, and he passed at the age of 80. He heard from Ghanim al-Burji, and a group of Abu Nu'aym's students, and left none behind like him. He passed away in Jumada al-Ula, and along with his proficient memory and expertise in Hadith narrators, he was a man of piety and worship."⁷

Note: It is important the our knowledge drives us to practice upon what we learn. The commands and teachings of Allah and His Messenger a must be seen in our practice, such as through worship and piety. This is what made these Imams exceptional.

Hafiz al-Dhahabi describes him as *al-Hafiz al-Kabir* (the grand Hadith master), *Shaikh al-Islam.* Husain al-Bawarri says that a person had once came up to him, stating that he had seen such a dream in which he seemed to have witnessed the Messenger of Allah ²⁶/₂₇'s passing. Husain al-Bawarri replied, "If you are truthful, then that would mean an Imam without equal has just passed away in his time, for indeed these types of dreams have been seen at the time of the passing of the likes of Imam al-Shafi', [Sufyan] al-Thawri, and Imam Ahmad ibn Hanbal." Al-Bawarri said, "By nighttime, we received the news of Hafiz Abu Musa's passing."⁸
